
Everyone, young and old, should be aware of electrical safety. Even children, years before starting school, need to be made aware of electrical dangers.




For your child's benefit, we ask that you take a few minutes and explain the safety features covered on each page, making certain that the child understands electrical safety.






OBEY ALL SAFETY SIGNS Don't play on guy wires, around transformers or near anything electrical!

SAFETY RULES TO REMEMBER

Obey all safety signs.

Keep fingers away from electrical outlets.

Never climb trees near power lines.

Stay away from a power line that is down. Tell someone to call the electric company.

Never put a ladder near a power line or close enough to touch the power line should the ladder fall.

Never touch anything electrical if you are wet. Keep radios, hair dryers and appliances and anything electrical away from water.


Stay away from substations, transformers or any electrical equipment.

Never play or swing on a guy wire (that is the wire that goes from the pole to the ground).

Stay away from anyone who is being shocked or who is touching an electric line. If you touch them the electricity will shock or kill you. Call for help.

Stay away from where the electric company linemen are working. They work with big trucks and heavy equipment. They may not be able to see you. You could be hurt.
